

THESE WORDS ARE LIKE SIGNALS

DO or DON'T DOES or DOESN'T DID or DIDN'T

(These are "helping verbs")

When you see one of these words, they signal you to use the BASE FORM OF VERB with it.

Present Simple: Do or Does + Base Verb

Do you usually drive to work?

When do you usually drive to work?

Does she usually walk to school?

When does she usually walk to school?

Simple Past: Did + Base Verb

Did you walk to school?

When did you walk to school?

Did she drive to work?

When did she drive to work?

Do and Does can be used to:

- 1) Form questions
- 2) Form negative statements
- 3) Give orders
- 4) To emphasize something

In Present Simple, the helping verb "Do" changes to "Does" in 3rd person singular (she, he, it) Do I, Do you, Do y'all, Do they, Do we Does she, Does he, Does it

In Simple Past, the helping verb "Did" Is used for all persons.

Did I, Did you, Did y'all, Did they, Did we Did she, Did he, Did it
